& in the 8<sup>th</sup> year of the independence of the united  
States of America

Whereas administration of all singular the goods & Chattels, Rights  
and Credits, which were of Ezekiel Lindsay — Late of the said  
District deceased was lately committed by the said ordinary to the said  
Betty Lindsay

The conditions of the foregoing obligation is such, that if the said
